

Credit Transfer Opportunities for Marquette University High School Students

AP Credit Policy

Marquette University awards credit in recognition for performance on AP examinations. A student may choose to take the credits awarded or take the equivalent course at Marquette. Dual-Enrollment Courses at Marquette University

Marquette University High School students are able to enroll in coursework at Marquette University for a discounted course rate of \$500. Students are encouraged to work with the MUHS College Counseling Office for assistance in selecting a course. SLU 1818 Course Transfer Options

If a Marquette University High School student elects to enroll in a dual-enrollment course in high school, he is encouraged to submit official transcripts to Marquette University for review. Typically, courses will transfer provided Marquette offers a comparable course and the student has earned a grade of "C" or better. A chart of currently transferable SLU 1818 course credits can be found on the reverse side.

Transfer credits reviewed in fall 2020. MU course equivalents are based on course descriptions and course outcomes that may be subject to change. Formal credit evaluations are completed at the time of admission and posted to the student's academic record. Credit awards may or may not affect degree progress and/or time to degree completion. MU students have academic advisors to help students understand how transfer credit applies to the intended program.
