

Course Selection for Sophomore year

Checklist for Selecting Courses: Check to make sure that you ...

- Have selected enough credits. **Six** is the normal load, although a student may take 5.5.
- Will have completed/ have selected one year of a **language** that you will take for 2 years.
- Will have completed/ have selected **World History**.
- Will have completed/ have selected **Biology/Honors Bio**.
- Fine Arts Courses:**
 - Students must take at least ½ credit; this can be taken any semester either as part of the regular schedule or as an overload.
 - **Jazz Lab 1 – 3** earns ½ credit and does not meet every day of the week. **Jazz 4** earns 1 credit and meets every day of the week.
 - **Chorus** can be a semester-long or year-long course. Students do not meet every day and earn ¼ credit each semester.
 - The rest of the Fine Arts courses meet daily for a full semester.

Balance note:

- Students who expect to add a job, a varsity level sport, religious education program (such as Confirmation), Pre-College program, or have responsibilities outside of the class day, should remember the increase in time commitment when selecting courses. Co-curricular and work commitments are not circumstances to allow a course drop.
- Students cannot choose in which semester a class will fall in their schedules. Whatever you choose, be sure that you want to be in that course either semester.
- Once courses are selected changes are rare and strictly follow the withdrawal policy. Your signature on the printout indicates you commit to the courses you select.
- Remember, you have service hours to complete this year outside of the school day.
