Early in the history of Jesuit schools, older students were selected to lead, instruct, and encourage the development of younger students. At MUHS, **The Freshman Retreat Leadership** is the modern version of this 400-year tradition in Jesuit Education. Being a part of the Freshman Retreat is not only an honor, but also a huge responsibility. As you know from your own freshman retreat, this unique retreat serves the freshman class as a memorable bonding experience and more importantly, a means to connect the freshman class to the living God.

CORE GROUP:

Serving on The Core Group means being a part of the initial planning team. You will be responsible for the shape and direction of the retreat. This is your opportunity to help this year's freshman class grow spiritually as a community who is here to "serve rather than to be served".

As part of the Core Group you would responsible for:

- Selecting the theme of the retreat, planning, and coordinating all activities around that theme.
- Meeting once a week, on **TUESDAY** evenings from 6:30-9:00pm: 9/11*(Sunday because of Kairos), 9/22, 9/27, 10/4 and 10/11. **Attendance is mandatory. You will be removed for an unexcused/foreseeable absence.**
- Chairing one of the committees for the retreat.
- Assisting the Captains, especially when training the small group leaders.
- Meeting with all the small group leaders on **MONDAY** evenings from 6:30-9:00pm: 10/24, 10/31, 11/6* (Sunday because of Kairos), 11/14, 1/9, 1/16, 1/23, 1/30 and the retreat on February 2nd-4th. **Attendance is mandatory. You will be removed for an unexcused/foreseeable absence.**
- Leading a small group during the retreat.
- If you are selected as a core group or small group leader, ***you won't be able to lead the November or February Kairos.***

SMALL GROUP LEADER:

Serving as a Small Group Leader entails; being part of a committee (led by a Core Group Leader) during small group meetings, leading a group of 5-6 Freshmen on retreat, and representing the ideals of Freshmen Retreat.

As part of the Core Group you would responsible for:

- If you are selected as a core group or small group leader, you won't be able to lead the November or February Kairos.
- Meeting with all the small group leaders on **MONDAY** evenings from 6:30-9:00pm: 10/24, 10/31, 11/6* (Sunday because of Kairos), 11/14, 1/9, 1/16, 1/23, 1/30 and the retreat on February

2nd-4th. **Attendance is mandatory. You will be removed for an unexcused/foreseeable absence.**

- Leading a small group during the retreat.
