ON DISPLAY


During the month of May, look for book displays on Cinco de Mayo, the labor movement, baseball, books made into movies, and awesome summer reads.

FROM SPRING WELCOMING TO WORKERS' RIGHTS: A BRIEF HISTORY OF MAY DAY

Since ancient times, we have celebrated spring with festivities that welcome more daylight, warmer weather, and the rebirth of nature. In modern times, May 1st or May Day has been associated with traditions like the May Pole, May Crowning, May Day Basket. In the late 19th century, these spring gatherings would serve an additional purpose, namely, an opportunity for people to congregate and advocate for the rights of laborers. On May 4th, 1886 in Chicago's Haymarket Square, a peaceful protest for an 8-hour workday took a violent turn. On that day a bomb was detonated and gunfire was exchanged taking the lives of seven police officers and four civilians. The eight men convicted of this crime were sentenced to death. In memory of this event, May 1st or May Day was declared International Labor Day. This holiday is celebrated around the world and often includes a day off of work!

FEATURED BOOK

When white supremacist Wade Michael Page murdered six people and wounded four in a Sikh Temple in Wisconsin in 2012, Pardeep Kaleka was devastated. The temple leader, now dead, was his father. Meanwhile, Arno Michaelis, a former skinhead and founder of one of the largest racist skinhead organizations in the world, had spent years of his life committing terrible acts in the name of white power. When he heard about the attack, waves of guilt washing over him, he knew he had to take action and fight against the very crimes he used to commit. After the Oak Creek tragedy, Arno and Pardeep worked together to start an organization called Serve 2 Unite, which works with students to create inclusive, compassionate and nonviolent climates in their schools and communities. Their story is one of triumph of love over hate, and of two men who breached a great divide to find compassion and forgiveness. ~Amazon
