
Ignite Our Hearts: Merrill Park Neighborhood



MUHS has deep roots in the Merrill Park Neighborhood. Developed on land purchased by Sherburn S. Merrill in the late 1800s, the neighborhood is comprised of the land between 30th and 35th Street and Wisconsin Avenue to the Valley. To the left is a stylized depiction of St. Rose of Lima Parish -- the heart and soul of the Merrill Park. It was not only a place of worship but also a community center for the growing Irish population that migrated west from the Third Ward. By the turn of the century, Merrill Park was given the nickname Political Row because it produced so many of Milwaukee's judges, attorneys, mayors, and government workers. In the 1950s, the 1-94 expressway project cut this vibrant neighborhood in half and forced many families to relocate. MUHS has anchored this neighborhood since 1922. If this building could talk, what stories it could tell!

Turtles All the Way Down by John Green. F GRE


