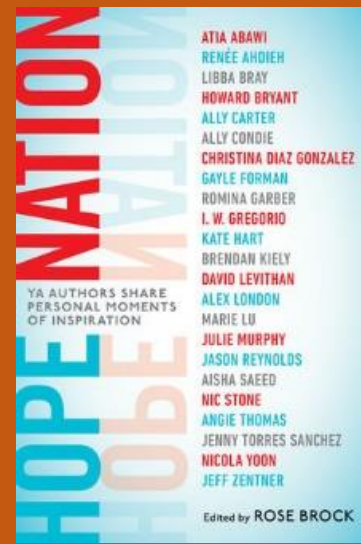
Ignite Our Hearts: Who Was Our Namesake?

Fr. Jacques Marquette, our school's namesake, was an explorer, missionary, and priest. Born in Laon, France on June 1, 1637, he entered the Society of Jesus at 17. He had a missionary zeal from the start and when the opportunity arose to send someone to New France, Marquette was chosen. Marquette had a good ear for languages and mastered at least six indigenous languages. We can imagine that his efforts allowed for greater and more meaningful dialogue with those he served. He also had a wonderful rapport with those who he encountered. Thus, after just a few years in Montreal, he was sent further west to help set up a mission near Sault Sainte Marie. It was here that he first encountered members of the Illinois tribe forced east due to territorial disputes with the Lakota. Imagine the stories they shared. Especially those of the "great water" to the west. It surely piqued Marquette's sense of adventure. In spring 1672, Louis Jolliet visited Marquette at his mission at St. Ignace. Jolliet held a commission to explore territory along the Mississippi River. Together they planned an expedition that would take them over 800 miles south of St. Ignace. Traveling on foot and by canoe, they traversed Lake Michigan, the Fox and Wisconsin Rivers, and entered the Mississippi traveling as far south as northern Louisiana. Marquette would make one more trek into Illinois to join in a large gathering of the Illinois Tribes near present-day Chicago. Plagued by dysentery since his travels with Jolliet, he died en route to St. Ignace in 1675 at the age of 38.
