

# — SCHEDULE ERROR CORRECTIONS —

**PLEASE READ THIS INFORMATION CAREFULLY.**

***Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to these guidelines.***

*Please check your schedule carefully for each of the following:*

- ✓ Do all required courses appear: Theology, English, Math, Social Studies, and Science?
- ✓ Do you have a minimum of 5 classes EACH semester?
- ✓ Are classes properly balanced between first and second semester? (If you have four classes one semester and six the next, that is a problem.)
- ✓ Are consecutive classes in the proper order? (Is Drawing before Adv Drawing?)
- ✓ Are you on track to fulfill all graduation requirements? This is your responsibility. **Failure to check now could result in serious problems.** Students must earn 23 credits in order to graduate. See graduation requirements below.
- ✓ Do you have class scheduled when you should be in lunch (4<sup>th</sup> period for Freshmen/Sophomores and 5<sup>th</sup> period for Juniors/Seniors)?
